

OUR PROCESS



1. DEFINE: Information Gathering, Analyzing and Planning

Successful projects require careful planning. At Todd Blank Design, we start by gaining insights through audience analysis of specific needs. We use research to clarify and set objectives and then we map out potential site structure and user task flows. The final deliverable of our Define Phase is a unique client strategy that delineates the creative approach, potential functionality and information architecture.

2. DESIGN: Blending Usability and Clear Content with Award-Winning Look and Feel

In this Phase, we map out scenarios for content organization, navigation and taxonomy. Then the visual design focuses on typography, color, layout, grid systems, imagery and motion to support the messaging and resonate with the intended audience. We view writing as an extension of design. People intuitively understand good writing as well as good design, as flow, sequence and composition occur both in language and in visual space.

3. DEVELOP: Technology in the Service of Design

Todd Blank Design's development process has been refined and reshaped throughout roughly 100 Web site projects. Getting Web sites to function and appear exactly as intended, across various platforms and Web browsers, is a highly specialized skill, one that we excel in. We have a passion for the combination of art and science that comprises this craft.
